Boat Maryland (BMD) – A Course on Responsible Boating

The law specifies that anyone born on or after July 1, 1972, must have a Certificate of Boating Safety Education in order to operate a mechanically propelled vessel on Maryland waters. The Maryland Basic Boating Course satisfies this requirement. Students prefer this class over the online version since they are able to ask questions, learn from others, and benefit from the practical experience and local knowledge of the instructors. Students must attend all classroom sessions and achieve a score of 80% on the final exam in order to pass.
