PROCEDURAL MATTERS

A. Principles of Parliamentary Law

- Courtesy to all
- Majority rule
- Justice for all
- One Item at a time
- Respect the rights of the minority
- Partiality for none
- Usually pro and con speakers will alternate and individual speaking will identify his or her position.
- No one is allowed to speak more than once on a pending question until all wishing to speak have been heard; a person can then speak a second time, but no more than twice (unless the body gives special permission by two-thirds vote for a third speech).

B. Relevant Provisions of Presbytery's Manual (Section III of Manual)

1. "No new business shall be introduced after Presbytery recesses for lunch (unless by two-thirds vote Presbytery sets a different deadline for introduction of new business), and any new business not listed on the Docket shall be presented in written form."
2. "...each elder elected an officer, Executive Presbyter, or a member of Council of Presbytery shall be enrolled as a member of the Presbytery for the term of office, whether or not commissioned by his or her session, in accordance with G-3.0306."
3. "The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to lay members of Presbytery's committees and to laypersons serving on Presbytery's staff, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery."
4. "The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to professional church educators serving the churches of Presbytery, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery."

NOTE: The phrase, "privilege of the floor without vote," means that the person has the privilege of speaking on the floor of Presbytery, including debating a motion under consideration, subject to rules and guidelines that govern discussion and debate. However, the person does not have the privilege to make motions or to vote.

Those who have "privilege of the floor without vote" are lay members of committees, lay members of Presbytery staff, church educators, and youth advisory delegates. Those with "voice and vote" privileges are member ministers, elder commissioners, Commissioned Lay Pastors, Executive Presbyter, Stated Clerk, Recording Clerk, Treasurer, Vice-Moderators, Moderator, and Council Members.

C. Procedural Rules for the meeting of Presbytery (approval by two-thirds vote required to adopt #3).

1. Persons wishing to speak to the Presbytery - giving a report, debating a motion, raising questions - will do so by using the microphones.
2. Each speaker, after recognition by the Moderator, will give his or her name and church name (or other relationship to the Presbytery if not pastor or elder commissioner from a session).
3. Limitation of Debate - 30 minutes per main motion, with each individual limited to 3 minutes per speech.
4. A recommendation from a committee or other entity elected by the Presbytery, upon being presented to Presbytery by an elected member of that entity, is considered to be on the floor for Presbytery's debate, amendment, and disposition without the necessity of a motion placing the recommendation on the floor.

MOTION BASICS

Steps of the Motion

1. *Commissioner* rises and addresses the Moderator.
2. *Moderator* recognizes commissioner and grants the floor.
3. *Commissioner* makes motion. (Commissioner may not debate before the motion is seconded.)
4. *Another commissioner* seconds the motion without recognition from the moderator.
5. *Moderator* states the motion.
6. *Moderator* calls for debate. (Maker of the motion has the privilege of first debate.) All speakers must address the moderator and be recognized by the moderator.
7. *Moderator* states the motion.
8. *Moderator* takes the vote and announces the vote and the results of the vote.
9. *Moderator* states the next order of business.

Seven Useful Motions

1. **Amend.** There are *only* three forms of simple amendment.

- a. To delete or strike out
- b. To add or insert
- c. To strike out and insert

The words proposed for deletion or addition *must be consecutive words*. When the amendment does not involve consecutive words or is longer than a paragraph, the motions “to substitute” (a form of amendment) is used. This is a difficult motion and should *never* be used when the simple form of amendment can be used.

2. **Commit or Refer.** To commit or refer back to committee for further study and amendment allows the consultative process to be used in greater depth. When this motion is made, it needs to state clearly what committee; appointment of the committee, if necessary; the task of the committee; and report time.
3. **Postpone to a Particular Time.** This motion takes precedence over the preceding two and has the power to grant additional time to a particular member or committee or do further study or consultation. It should always be used in preference to “table” because it permits debate on the propriety of postponement.
4. **Limits on Debate.** The assembly always has the power and the moderator the right of suggestion, to limit debate to a particular hour, or extend or shorten speeches according to the necessity of the moment. Limits on the length of speeches are advisable in instances where the issue before the assembly is highly divisive and many members wish to speak.
5. **Previous Question.** The maker of the motion “to move the previous question” (close debate and immediately take the vote) must be recognized by the moderator and the motion must receive a second. *It is never in order when called from the floor.* This motion should never be considered when it is used to prevent legitimate debate.
6. **Lay on the Table.** This motion is seldom necessary. The motion “to postpone” is always preferable because of its lower rank and its “debatability”. Misuse of the subsidiary motion can be a strategy that seriously abridges the rights of the assembly because of its high rank and its adoption by majority vote

1. The minutes of the August 19, 2014 Presbytery meeting have been approved in accordance with the Manual of Presbytery.
2. Statement on the balance of Teaching Elders and Ruling Elders in the presbytery. The Book of Order in G-3.0301 requires that a presbytery address any imbalance that may exist between the number of voting Teaching Elders and the number of voting Ruling Elders. No significant imbalance appears to exist in the Presbytery of West Virginia. As of December 1, 2014 there are 135 congregations entitled to send 138 Ruling Elders to meetings of the presbytery. There are 123 Teaching Elder members of presbytery.
3. The Roll and Registers of Presbytery as of December 1, 2014 are attached.
4. Voting on the proposed amendments to the constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA) will take place at the February 28, 2015 meeting of presbytery. **Churches are strongly encouraged to elect the Ruling Elder Commissioner who will attend this meeting as soon as possible.** The amendment booklets will be mailed to churches on January 2, 2015. This mailing will also include other resources for study and preparation. The Nurture Committee is offering several *Equipping Disciples* events to help Teaching Elders, Ruling Elders and church members study the proposed Confession of Belhar; the details of these

events are found on one of the flyers distributed at registration. The presbytery newsletter will also feature resources as we all prepare to discern the guidance of the Holy Spirit. **Teaching Elders are reminded of their role in assisting the Ruling Elder Commissioners from their churches to be informed commissioners to this meeting!**

The 2013-2015 Book of Order in G-3.0104 and G-3.0305 states that the Stated Clerk shall keep the rolls of presbytery's membership and registers of all Certified Christian Educators, Certified Associate Christian Educators and ruling elders commissioned to particular pastoral service. Ministry – Mission – Building Relationships

We celebrate and give thanks to God for our 135 congregations, who bring light into the communities in this presbytery! With every church focused on ministry, mission and building relationships (our core value), we truly make a difference within the communities in which our churches reside.

Some highlights:

- The West Virginia Institute for Leaders in Ministry began in early September 2014, meeting monthly, with our nine participants learning leadership skills, which will benefit our presbytery. The new initiative grew out of a focus on leadership development, from our Presbytery’s Leadership Team.
- Addressing hunger within our communities is a focus of so many of our congregations, through food pantry ministries. The Mission Committee and our Hunger Action Enabler help to resource and support these efforts. Todd Wright serves as the chairperson for the Mission Committee.
- Clusters continue to develop, with Cluster Shepherds volunteering to help build relationships, pastoral care and mission opportunities within closer geographical areas within the presbytery. Susan Sharp Campbell led a training session for Cluster Shepherds on August 29 at First Presbyterian, Charleston. Nancy Tissue brings enthusiasm and energy as the chairperson of the Relations Committee.
- Bluestone hosted weekend groups following the successful 2014 camp season and has re-seeded the “football field,” following our first ever successful band camp, which brought new revenue to the Bluestone program. John McKinnon, a former camp director, serves as the chairperson for the Bluestone Committee.
- “Playology” has brought together a diverse group of church leaders and members, incorporating church recreational and creative ideas to strengthen the church life of our congregations. The Nurture Committee develops with, in addition to many other nurturing opportunities. Kari Preslar serves as the Chairperson for the Nurture Committee.
- The Ministry Committee works so hard to bring light into sometimes tough situations, as well as supporting our congregations in times of transitions. The dedicated, faithful members of this committee serve us all, and we thank them all, including the chairperson, Cinda Harkless and lead staff, Craig Butler.
- Our presbytery staff is focused on resourcing and serving our presbytery committees, churches, pastoral leaders and members. Since the adoption of the Jeremiah 29:11 plan on December 11, 2011, we have had five new staff persons come aboard, with more transition yet to come. Our Administration Committee works hard in these search efforts, ably led by Sharon Rowe.

ASSOCIATE PRESBYTER FOR MISSION JOB DESCRIPTION

The Associate Presbyterian for Mission will work for the Presbytery of West Virginia in the areas of Older Adult Ministries, Hunger Action and Social Justice. He or she will work as an advocate, pastor and educator, assisting in the mission needs of the Presbytery, as well as mission issues supported by the PCUSA. This position will be divided as follows: ½ time Older Adult Ministry, ¼ time Hunger Action, ¼ time Social Justice. It is understood that this is a rough estimate and that time may vary based on the needs of the WV Presbytery.

ACCOUNTABILITY: He/she shall be accountable to the Presbytery of West Virginia and will be supervised by the General Presbyterian.

RELATIONSHIPS: The Associate Presbyterian for Mission will relate directly to the Mission Committee.

COMPENSATION: Specified in the letter of appointment and reviewed annually by the Administration Committee.

EVALUATION: An annual performance review and evaluation by the Administration Committee.

TERMINATION: By mutual consent of the Associate Presbyterian for Mission and the Presbytery, or by action of Presbytery, upon written recommendation of the Administration Committee (G-3.0110). Fair and adequate notification shall be given to the Associate for Mission and to the Presbytery.

PERSON DESCRIPTION

The Associate Presbyterian for Mission should have these qualifications, characteristics, and abilities:

1. A personal commitment to and relationship with God.
2. A strong biblical grounding in the Christian faith.

PURPOSE: The Associate Presbyterian for Ministry with Older Adults shall encourage and support ministry with older adults within the Presbytery of West Virginia. One major aspect of this ministry will be working with congregations to assist in the development of appropriate responses to older adult needs and opportunities. A second major aspect will be as resource person for program development to meet the needs of residents

of facilities under contract to Presbyterian Housing Foundation of West Virginia, Inc., and to provide support to resident managers and social service coordinators employed by Presbyterian Housing Foundation of West Virginia, Inc.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- B. To acquire and share knowledge of social and financial resources available to older adults through governmental and church related entities.
- C. To assist in the provision of pastoral care for residents of facilities under contract to Presbyterian Housing Foundation of West Virginia, Inc., using both Presbyterian and ecumenical resources.
- D. To offer supportive counsel to resident managers and social service coordinators employed by Presbyterian Housing Foundation of West Virginia, Inc., as they seek to deal with problems and frustration in their work.
- E. To serve as a communication link between Presbyterian Housing Foundation of West Virginia, Inc., residents, and resident directors as needs and issues require.
- F. To be an advocate for ministry with older adults in the Presbytery of West Virginia
- G. To consult with local congregations and assist them in designing ministries with and for older adults.
- H. To be a resource in the training of local church leaders in appropriate responses to the needs and opportunities of older adults.
- I. To develop and provide seminars that will meet the needs of congregations.
- J. To assist ministers with members of their congregation who are in crisis situations.

RELATIONSHIPS: The Associate Presbyter for Ministries with Older Adults will work closely with the resident managers and social services coordinators, and in consultation with the General Presbyter and other Presbytery staff. He/she will work collaboratively with the Mission Committee. It is anticipated that 60% of the person's time will be used in response to Presbytery-related needs and 40% will be used in response to West Virginia Management-related needs.

ASSOCIATE FOR PRESBYTER FOR MISSION - HUNGER ACTION ENABLER

1/4 TIME

PURPOSE: The Associate Presbyter for Mission, Hunger Action Enabler, shall interpret and implement within the Presbytery of West Virginia the denomination's hunger action program at the local, regional and national level with emphasis on these five aspects: direct food relief, development assistance, education and interpretation, public policy, and lifestyle integrity.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- A. Be a spokesperson for Hunger Action within the Presbytery through:
 - 1. Cents-Ability – assistance to congregations in the adoption and promotion, general promotion within the Presbytery, implementation of adopted uses of the funds.

PURPOSE: The Associate Presbyter for Mission, Social Justice, shall interpret and implement within the Presbytery of West Virginia the denomination's Social Justice Ministry focuses at the local, regional and national level. He or She will support and assist in developing the Social Justice ministries within the congregations of the WV Presbytery and educate the Presbytery on social justice issues embraced by the denomination.

Biography – Ellen Dawson

My decision to become a Minister of Word and Sacrament has been a long process. I always tell people that God has been “tapping me on the shoulder” since I was 17 years old, and I clearly remember the first time I was confronted with the thought of being called to ministry. It was at Camp Allegheny, a United Methodist church camp I had gone to since I was in 7th grade. Even though I was brought up in a Christian home, and was very involved in my United Methodist congregation, Camp Allegheny is where I started to understand what having Jesus Christ as a personal Lord and Savior was all about. “...continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught...” *Colossians 2:6-7*

Despite this initial call to ministry, I was still determined to stay on the path to becoming a professional in Public Relations. After graduating with a B.A. in Communications from Heidelberg College (Tiffin, OH), and a PR job in Columbus, Ohio, I moved to Mt. Pleasant, SC. There, I joined Mt. Pleasant Presbyterian Church and I quickly plugged myself in to the congregation, making friends who stood by me through a personally difficult period in my life. A huge turning point for my spiritual journey was during a youth mission trip to Jamaica in 2003, for which I was a chaperone with MPPC. I was more open to the Holy Spirit than I had ever been before, and on the last night there, I heard God speak to me. He gave me clear call to mission service. With the support of my pastor, friends, and family, I started looking for what this call meant. It was a few months later that I found the PC (U.S.A.)’s Young Adult Volunteer Program, and it became an attainable next step for me. I ended up serving as a YAV for a year in Guatemala. “*And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.*” *Romans 8:28*

After I returned from my YAV year, I decided to pursue my call to become a Minister of Word and Sacrament. I went to Pittsburgh Theological Seminary (PTS) in the fall of 2006, and chose Pittsburgh not only because it was near where I grew up, but because of the seminary’s focus on mission and pastoral theology. My pastoral identity, articulation of theology, and my personal relationship with Christ were molded into something I never expected. I felt pushed, yet led; challenged, yet at peace; confident, yet humble. Through my work with the World Mission Initiative office on campus, I saw how my heart and passion for mission will always be a part of who I am as a pastor, whether in the mission field or serving a church. I grew as a leader, a disciple, a friend, and a world Christian. I see my time at PTS as a gift from God. “*May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face shine on us—so that your ways may be known on earth, your salvation among all nations.*” *Psalms 67:1-2*

After graduation, I moved to North Carolina to work as an Interim Director of CE at Hopewell Presbyterian Church in Huntersville, North Carolina, working alongside a friend and former pastor. After the year in North Carolina, I moved to Tucson, Arizona to begin a call to campus ministry at The University of Arizona. I was ordained in October of 2011, which was the culmination of such a long journey—and the beginning of another. During my time in Tucson, I served on the Committee on Preparation for Ministry and also co-led one of Fuller Seminary's Micah Group Preaching Cohorts. I also had the opportunity to be a part of the Worship Resource Team for the PC (U.S.A.)'s Collegiate Ministries Office—our team wrote compiled a worship resource specifically for campus ministers, which will be published in 2015. In addition, I led the New Wilmington Mission Conference (NWMC) Summer Service Team to Nepal, and continue to serve on the staff of NWMC every summer.

Every week, I use a benediction from Hebrews 12 with the college students, and this scripture encourages me daily: *“Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith....”*

Statement of Faith – Ellen Dawson

I believe in one God in three persons: God the Father, Jesus Christ, God's only Son, and the Holy Spirit, who proceeds from both the Father and the Son. The three persons of the Trinity are intimately and mysteriously inter-related.

I believe in God as the Creator of the world and of humankind. I believe God created us in His image and wants nothing more than a personal love relationship with us, His children. I believe that God is Love and God is a keeper of covenants. I believe in a God who, out of free grace and love, chose us for salvation.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's one and only Son, who was born of the virgin Mary and who was conceived by the Holy Spirit in order for God to enter this earthly world as a human being. I believe that Jesus lived and breathed as a human, walking the earth with the purpose to teach and fulfill God's plan for him and for humankind. I believe Jesus is the Word incarnate. I believe Jesus was baptized, was a teacher, friend, healer, prophet, and humble servant. I believe Jesus Christ innocently suffered and died on the cross at Calvary in order to take on the sins of the world. I believe Christ's blood was shed as atonement, and that Christ, though dead, was resurrected on the third day in order to conquer death. Jesus Christ rose to sit at the right hand of God, and will come again. I believe in Jesus Christ as my personal Lord and Savior.

I believe that although we humans continue to sin, God's free gift of grace, as exemplified in Jesus Christ, remains for us today and throughout eternity. The grace has been given to us, not as a result of works, but as a result of our faith in Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul writes, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God-not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9). I believe that we must continually repent, turning away from our sinful ways, confessing our shortcomings, and asking God for forgiveness. I believe that forgiveness is available to us as a result of God's love and Christ's love for us, for it is in Christ that we are forgiven.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, who works through our faith as a cultivator and nurturer of that faith. I believe the Holy Spirit is active in this world, opening our eyes and hearts to help us know the reality of our salvation. I believe that the Holy Spirit speaks to us through prayer and through scripture. The power of the Holy Spirit allows for us to be illumined by the words of Scripture, fight against evil forces, and know and use our Spiritual gifts for the building up of the body of Christ. I believe in the authority of scripture, and that the Word of God written serves as a witness to God's self-revelation. I believe that both the Old and New Testaments exist for us to know, study, and live

by. I believe in the work of the Holy Spirit as we read and live out the Word of God. I also believe that scripture serves as instructions for the Church and for all believers.

I believe in the purpose of gathering as a church community to fellowship, receive instruction, confess, praise God, pray, and celebrate the sacraments. The church does this in order to encourage one another inwardly so that each individual member may be sent outwardly as "the church in the world."¹ I believe that the church's goal is to worship so that we will be fueled for mission and more able to let Christ's love shine through us. I believe that we celebrate baptism as a sign of God's covenant and an adoption into the family of Christ. Because the Church is the body of Christ, we are bound together as brothers and sisters through Christ and through the miracle of baptism. I believe that Holy Communion the Lord's Supper, is a sacramental action as taught in scripture. The practice of eating the bread and drinking the wine was instituted by Jesus Christ as remembrance of him and as a proclamation to his coming kingdom.

I believe in The Great Commission and the mission of the church in this nation and world. I believe that "the Church exists by mission as fire exists by burning"² and that the church is called to the work of mission and reconciliation. As Christ's followers, witnesses, and representatives, I believe that we have a responsibility towards the poor and marginalized, and that we shall work to establish justice. REPORT OF THE LEADERSHIP TEAM TO THE PRESBYTERY

Date: December 13, 2014

Items for the Presbytery's ACTION:

1. The following are proposed changes to the Presbytery Manual. They were presented at the August 19 Presbytery meeting as a first reading. Changes are shown in italics.

- a. In section III Responsibilities, powers and meetings of Presbytery, Membership, paragraph 3:

“The privilege of the floor without vote shall be granted to certified church educators and other certified church workers serving churches of Presbytery, if not enrolled as members of the Presbytery...” (G-2.1102)

Explanation: Church business administrators and church musicians may be certified through their respective Presbyterian professional organizations. The *Book of Order* allows them privilege of the floor if approved by Presbytery.

- b. Insert a new paragraph 2 in the same section:

Churches with memberships of 1 to 500 may send one ruling elder commissioner to meetings of Presbytery. Churches with memberships of 501 to 1,000 may send two ruling elder commissioners. Churches with memberships of 1,001 to 1,500 may send three ruling elder commissioners.

Explanation: The current *Book of Order* no longer states the number of ruling elder commissioners churches are to send to meetings of Presbytery, leaving that decision to each Presbytery.

2. The Leadership Team has the responsibility of nominating persons to the Presbytery Nominating Committee. We nominate the following:

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3. The Leadership Team has been advised that it would be very helpful for planning future events if the Presbytery meeting dates were on a fixed schedule. Therefore, we recommend the following schedule:

Items for the Presbytery's INFORMATION:

1. Approved the celebration of the Lord's Supper at the annual Ministry Committee retreat in January, 2015 at Blessed John XXIII Pastoral Center, Charleston.
2. In September, the Leadership Team met in special session to review the progress of the Presbytery in transitioning to the Jeremiah 29:11 Plan. The next pages itemize some of the important points of the Jeremiah Plan and the current status.

One concern that the LT discussed at length is the loss of the former congregational development committee. This responsibility was assigned to the Ministry Committee, but the Ministry Committee has such a full workload that it cannot address congregational development. We also feel the deep loss of the work of the former Quadrant Presbyters and the relationships they had with the churches in their charge. They were valuable resources to the congregations. The LT has formed an *ad hoc* group to explore the possibility of forming staff positions for Regional Presbyters who would serve much as the Quadrant Presbyters did. This group is being formed with representation from Ministry Committee, Administration Committee, Relations Committee and Stewardship Committee.

3. An *ad hoc* committee of John Holland, George Lilley and Pam Ferrell, along with Rocky Poole and Forrest Palmer, was formed and is charged with determining criteria for distributing Synod funds to help churches with added Board of Pensions expenses in 2015.

Jeremiah 29:11 Plan Progress Report

The Presbytery of West Virginia has experienced many changes during the last two years since it adopted the recommendations of the Jeremiah 29:11 Mission Study Group. The following is a thumbnail sketch of what recommendations have been implemented and what still needs work.

Clusters: "The churches...will be organized into clusters as geographical divisions...with purposes of mission, ministry, and relationship building..." Information, forms and documents are available on the PWV website. Conference calling, video conferencing, and webinars are used when appropriate.
Pastoral Leadership: "...support the work of the ALP/CLP training..." "...encourage Clusters to arrange worship opportunities" for churches without installed pastoral leader. Encourage "For Such a Time as This" program	ALP/CRE training continues. Clusters, through Shepherds and Peer Groups, are planning events for worship, and fellowship. Several churches have pastoral leadership through this program.
Leadership Team: "They should provide strategic leadership, leaving management of ministry and mission to committees."	To some degree, the Leadership Team still struggles with what it's role is. The LT supervised the Presbytery <i>Manual</i> revision, set priorities for the Presbytery, monitors the work of committees, and handles business not assigned to committees.
Committees: Eleven committees replaced sixteen former committees.	All committees are up and running. The Leadership Team is looking at the work load of the Ministry Committee and the possible need to find an alternative for the former congregational development responsibilities.

2013. Two others are interim positions. The search committee for the General Presbyter is in the process of being formed. The Leadership Team has noted that we sorely miss the ministries of Quadrant Pastors who formed close relationships and gave valuable help to congregations in their care. The LT is exploring this further.

At their May, 2013 meeting, the Leadership Team went through a strategic-planning process and identified the following five areas of focus.

Focus on Mission: “The Presbytery will encourage the clusters to identify and pursue at least one mission activity annually in the communities they serve.”	Some Clusters are exploring mission activities
Development and Strengthening of Clusters	The Relations Committee has identified, organized and found leadership for most of the clusters. The position description for Cluster Shepherds was developed and training was held for Cluster Shepherds this year. The activities of the Clusters varies, depending on the members’ interests.
Leadership Development: “The Presbytery will establish and operate a leadership development program”	The Leadership Development Task Force developed and initiated the “West Virginia Institute for Leaders in Ministry,” utilizing trained instructors and targeting pastors, CREs and educators. The year-long program currently has nine participants, and was partially underwritten by a \$10,000 grant from the Synod of the Trinity
Marketing and Communications: Presbytery will engage professionals to assist in developing and implementing internal and external communication plans to connect Presbyterians to each other, to the clusters, to the Presbytery and to mission activities in the community.”	A new presbytery logo was designed and approved, as well as a mission statement, adopted by Presbytery on August 19, 2014.
Enhanced Utilization of Technology: “The Presbytery will engage a professional to help identify and implement new technologies, including possibly social media...”	See “Communications” above.

REPORT OF THE MISSIONS COMMITTEE TO THE PRESBYTERY

Date: Dec. 13, 2014

Items for the Presbytery's ACTION:

1. **(CA)** That the December 13th offering be split evenly between ... the Mountaineer Food Bank and Facing Hunger in Huntington, two organizations addressing poverty in West Virginia.

Items for the Presbytery's INFORMATION:

1. The Missions Committee met October 28th at the Campus Ministry Center in Morgantown in order to tour the construction of Central Place and the Harless Center. (Leasing begins this Fall and the opening will be in May of 2015.)
2. We received an update on the Nyeri partnership. D & E will not be going there in January due to concerns over Ebola (instead they will be going to Nicaragua), but Bob McCutcheon will still go to work on relations. He hopes to schedule a visit of representatives from Nyeri to WV in 2015.
3. We are tentatively planning to reschedule to Hurricane Sandy mission trip to NJ for June 7-12, 2015, "if the way be clear."
4. There were few grant requests. We reviewed and approved those we received and extended the grant deadline until December 1st. We also reviewed a Brick and Mortar request but tabled it until more information can be gathered.
5. We reviewed a draft covenant with Davis Stuart. It was approved and recommended to Leadership Team for their review and presbytery's vote.
6. We heard reports about a Wellness and Water conference in Charleston; solar panel going in at Shepherdstown Presbyterian; and WVMAW's busy year (74 groups hosted in 2014, with 31 already scheduled for 2015).
7. Stewardship of Creation received a \$1500 grant from the denomination for environmental education!
8. We discussed the poverty focus for the December presbytery meeting and made adjustments to the schedule.
9. We voted to recommend that the offering for the December Presbytery meeting be split equally between the Mountaineer Food Bank and Facing Hunger in Huntington, since both organizations are addressing poverty in West Virginia.
10. We brainstormed topics for workshops at Festival of Faith.
11. We toured the new Harless Center/ Central place as well as the Campus Ministry Center.
12. We will communicate electronically in December after the new grant deadline to finalize grants for 2015. Our face to face next meeting will be in 2015 at a place and time to be determined.
